Captain, United States Navy, Retired—Owner Healthy Visions, Clinton, TN. Ron Eslinger After beginning his military service in the US Army Reserves (1969-85), Capt. Eslinger became an officer and nurse anesthetist for the US Navy in 1985 at age 37. In 1991, Eslinger was assigned the committee position of anesthesia liason to the new Joint Commission Standard for I.V. conscious sedation. The training he created for Navy revolved into the he sedation certification training.

His many assignments included Senior Nurse Executive and the Director for Patient Services, Naval Hospital Beaufort, SC (2001-03). From 1996 to 2001, Ron served as the Chief Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) and Assistant Department Head for Administration, Anesthesia Department, US Naval Medical Center Portsmouth, VA where he founded and personally developed the Medical Center's Complementary Care Clinic. This experience led to consulting positions with other medical centers such as Kaiser Permanente, Portland, Oregon; Naval Hospital Camp Lejeune, NC; and Naval Hospital, Beaufort, SC.

Allan Schwartz is a 1980 graduate of Baylor College of Dentistry and 1994 graduate of Washington University School of Nurse Anesthesia, Dr. Schwartz has been teaching anesthesia to Dentists, Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists, Physicians, and Nurses for over 10 years. He is currently employed as a locum tenens CRNA, and is a Clinical Assistant Professor in the department of Periodonties at the Center for Advanced Dental Education at Saint Louis University. He also provides deep

sedation in various dental offices in the state of Missouri, and is one of only two Missouri general dentists who possess a deep sedation/general anesthesia permit granted by the Missouri Dental Board.
